8	 Key Issues & Lessons Learnt from Chapter Chair & Technical Council Reports - LC Focus on analysis of reporting received and Event Reports (L31) submissions, followed by a brainstorming session on improving chapter and council operations. EA shared his experiences at PES chapter. Mentioned the cost of physical events. HM noted challenges contacting chapter members and was encouraged to use eNotices. MC suggested that chapters can reduce costs by inviting conference keynote speakers to deliver Distinguished Lectures while in Section. IK suggested that Chapters should consider industry hosts for Distinguished Lectures.
